
BANGARRA DANCE THEATRE

The work which highlights the women's responsibility to cultural maintenance is interwoven with the traditional "inma" (dance and song) of women from the Central Desert. These particular dances are based on the Tjukurpa* and will depict the travels of ancestors.

(Women's Dance & Song) 30 November-11 December

Traditional Aboriginal women have a ceremonial life separate and secret to men. Women's Law, with its attendant rituals, ceremonies, songs and dances, must be performed and passed on for the maintenance of traditional life. This need to exchange ceremonial cycles and to reinforce traditional ties with women

from other communities celebrates the importance and power of

traditional Women's Law and demonstrates through their own chosen medium the continuing strength and importance of women's traditional expression; and allows them to influence, direct and maintain the social, political and cultural life of their own communities.






