Bangarra is an Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander organisation and one of Australia's leading performing arts companies. We are widely acclaimed nationally and around the world for our powerful dancing, distinctive theatrical voice and utterly unique soundscapes, music and design.

Led by Artistic Director Stephen Page, our dance technique is forged from over 40,000 years of culture, infused with contemporary movement. The company's dancers are professionally trained, dynamic artists who represent the pinnacle of Australian dance. Each has a proud Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander background, from various locations across the country.

Our relationships with Indigenous communities are the heart of Bangarra, with our repertoire created on Country and stories gathered from respected community Elders. It's this inherent connection to our land and people that makes us unique and enjoyed by audiences from remote Australian regional centres to New York.

Bangarra's annual program includes a national tour of a world premiere work, performed in Australia's most iconic venues; a regional tour allowing audiences outside of capital cities the opportunity to experience Bangarra, and an international tour to maintain our global reputation for excellence

Our regional tours are a special time of year for the company, connecting us with the communities that inspire our stories, as well as exposing new audiences to a positive representation of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander culture.














BROLGA

In Brolga (part of Corroboree 2001), Page explores the relationship between humans, creatures and the land, reflecting the intrinsic spirituality of the natural world. The songs and dances tell the stories of ancient myths that connect to more than 40,000 years of Aboriginal life - the world's oldest living culture. Set in the sacred ground of the brolgas (large birds) who live in the wetlands of Arnhem Land, a young girl plays, mimics and discovers the sensual and magical nature of the environment. She surrenders herself to become one of the flocks of brolgas in an alliance of understanding and belonging.


